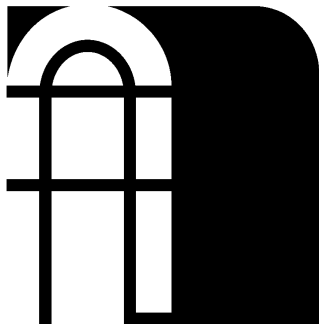

The Organ

The present organ was built in 1991 by Australian Pipe Organs, restoring and expanding the 1866 Fincham organ. 2 manuals, 18 speaking stops, 8 couplers. Gt: 8.8.4.4.2.III. Sw: 8.8.8.4.2.III.8. Ped: 16.16.10-2/3.8.4.

The Old Cathedral's organist is David Brown. David undertook studies as an organ scholar at the Universities of Cambridge and St Andrews. He also serves as College Organist for Scotch College.

The Bells

Melbourne's first peal of bells were the six bells hung in St James' Cathedral in 1853, replacing an old ship's bell. Two more were added in 1885. All were cast by Mears and Stainbank of Whitechapel Road, London, and are reputed to be the finest ever cast there. They are still rung regularly by a team of volunteers.

¹⁴as you have already understood us in part—
that on the day of the Lord Jesus we are your boast
even as you are our boast.

¹⁵Since I was sure of this, I wanted to come to you first,
so that you might have a double favour;

¹⁶I wanted to visit you on my way to Macedonia,
and to come back to you from Macedonia
and have you send me on to Judea.

¹⁷Was I vacillating when I wanted to do this?

Do I make my plans according to ordinary human standards,
ready to say ‘Yes, yes’ and ‘No, no’ at the same time?

¹⁸As surely as God is faithful,
our word to you has not been ‘Yes and No.’

¹⁹For the Son of God, Jesus Christ,
whom we proclaimed among you, Silvanus and Timothy and I,
was not ‘Yes and No’; but in him it is always ‘Yes.’

²⁰For in him every one of God’s promises is a ‘Yes.’
For this reason it is through him that we say the ‘Amen’,
to the glory of God.

²¹But it is God who establishes us with you in Christ and has anointed us, ²²by putting his seal on us and giving us his Spirit in our hearts as a first instalment.

²³But I call on God as witness against me: it was to spare you that I did not come again to Corinth.

²⁴I do not mean to imply that we lord it over your faith; rather, we are workers with you for your joy, because you stand firm in the faith.

^{2:1}So I made up my mind not to make you another painful visit.

²For if I cause you pain, who is there to make me glad but the one whom I have pained?

³And I wrote as I did, so that when I came, I might not suffer pain from those who should have made me rejoice; for I am confident about all of you, that my joy would be the joy of all of you.

⁴For I wrote to you out of much distress and anguish of heart and with many tears, not to cause you pain, but to let you know the abundant love that I have for you.

⁵But if anyone has caused pain, he has caused it not to me, but to some extent—not to exaggerate it—to all of you.

⁶This punishment by the majority is enough for such a person; ⁷so now instead you should forgive and console him, so that he may not be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow.

⁸So I urge you to reaffirm your love for him.

⁹I wrote for this reason: to test you
and to know whether you are obedient in everything.

¹⁰Anyone whom you forgive, I also forgive.

What I have forgiven, if I have forgiven anything,
has been for your sake in the presence of Christ.

¹¹And we do this so that we may not be outwitted by Satan;
for we are not ignorant of his designs.

We are very sad to share the news of the death of our sister in Christ, Isabel Moyra Dale. Isabel's faith in the Lord Jesus Christ during her illness has been a shining beacon of hope to all those who have journeyed alongside her for the last six years. Please remember her husband Lauren and children Tarek and Miriam in your prayers.

Isabel and her family served with CMS in the Middle East for over two decades. During those years, Isabel completed two unique ethnographic research projects exploring the lives and experiences of Muslim women. Her outstanding scholarship in the area of Women in Islam was rooted in the deep and trusting relationships that she built.

Lauren and Isabel returned to Melbourne in 2007 and joined the staff team at CMS's training college, St Andrew's Hall. Isabel has equipped a generation of gospel workers to love and appreciate the people and cultures in which they serve. Lauren was instrumental in founding the English Conversation Class ministries at St Paul's Cathedral and St James' Old Cathedral.

Isabel combined her incisive intelligence and passionate communication with a deep love for the Lord Jesus and those she taught. She poured out her life to equip many women to serve in gospel ministry around the world, especially in Islamic contexts. The Angelina Noble Centre, When Women Speak and CMS have been especially blessed by Isabel's ministry; she also taught extensively at SMBC, MST, Ridley College, and Columbia International University.

We give great thanks to God for Isabel's life, confident that she is now with her Father in heaven.
